President's Report

Dear Siblings in Christ at Good Soil,

The Spirit of God comes and goes as God pleases and brings forth life when the imperishable seed of God's Word is sown in good soil (Mark 4:8; John 3:8).

Indeed, God's word has been sown in the last 12 months! The Congregation Council and the Congregation have continued to work with God to build a garden where the soil will be more fertile, where more seeds will be planted, and where God's word will flourish. This year's Annual Reports for 2021-2022 shares with you the work put forth by many this past year to ensure God's word will be told and God's work will be done both inside and outside our church walls.

Inside our walls, the Gathering Again task force continued to strategize and advise as to how we could congregate safely this last year as COVID ebbed and flowed. How wonderful it is to see again the smiles on our fellow worshipper's faces and while also providing a specific area for those wanting or needing a masking-only safe space. The Property Committee was hard at work maintaining the church as well as bidding out the roofing work to contractors. The Sunday school teachers were busy teaching God's word to 14 regularly participating children with more children coming in the fall. The Generosity Team was very successful in the beginning stages of creating a culture of generosity and abundance in the congregation. The Nominating Committee has put together an exciting slate of Council candidates to help lead us into future.

We are reaching outside our walls with improvements to our online capabilities enabling people to worship with us as far away as Florida, California, and even India. Our continued and expanding relationships with Meal on Wheels and Lutheran Metropolitan Ministries, along with financial contributions to ELCA World Disaster Fund for Ukraine, and support of Trials for Hope are critical life lines to people outside our walls. We will be further reaching out to the community with our Open Doors initiative—a Little Library and meditative garden space in the front yard. The Community Pet Blessing and the Lenten Small Groups spread seeds of faith and community not only to those inside our walls but also outside.

Additionally, the Dandelion Team has been endeavoring on a two-year congregational renewal process focused on spiritual growth and in other ways to reach out to the

community. We are excited about how the Lord will inspire this team to lead us in his work and to new life!

We are truly blessed and thankful to have a loving and caring congregation along with a truly dedicated church council. Thank you to everyone who has helped make Good Soil a loving and hope-inspiring church this last year!

Pastor's Report

This is what God says, the God who builds a road right through the ocean, who carves a path through pounding waves... "Forget about what's happened; don't keep going over old history. Be alert, be present. I'm about to do something brand-new. It's bursting out! Don't you see it? There it is! I'm making a road through the desert, rivers in the wilderness...

- Isaiah 43:16-19 (The Message)

Grace and peace be with you! God continues to do brand new things in and among us. They are bursting forth even now—can you see them?

Just a year ago, we celebrated the "Great Return" to in-person worship, but this was not a return to 'everything we've always done the way we've always done it.' On the contrary, the Holy Spirit has been actively moving among us, challenging and empowering us to do things we may have never thought possible before, and continually inviting us to contemplate questions like, "What is the role of church in this day and age? What is God calling us to do and be here and now? How do we live into new ways of being Good Soil together as we emerge from this pandemic chapter?"

We know that connecting with others through meaningful relationships is a crucial part of that. Growing in our relationships with God, with one another, with our surrounding community, and with all of God's beloved creation is more important than ever as we come out of this pandemic. Over the past year, we have explored intentional ways to do that both internally through practicing faith story-sharing and externally through community leader interviews and partnership-building. The Dandelion Project has been a catalyst for much of this exploration and discovery (see Dandelion report), but there are many additional ways the Spirit has "made roads through the desert and rivers in the wilderness" over the past year as well.

I hope you will take some time to read the stories and see the pictures of God's great love and vibrant spirit at work in, among, and through the faith community here at Good Soil. In addition to the reports, here are some further highlights of the past year:

Summer of 2021:

- ❖ A series of Summer Community Dinners at parishioners' homes were held not only for fellowship and to get more acquainted/reconnected after a year of isolation, but also to share personal and congregational stories with one another through a timeline discussion activity.
- Attention to hospitality and welcome with the addition of our name tag wall and development of Good Soil "Swag Bags" for first time guests.

Christmas in July worship on July 25, 2021 complete with sanctuary decorations and Christmas carols galore. You can view that worship service here.

Fall of 2021:

- Observed the Season of Creation in worship during the month of September, complete with a Community Pet Blessing on the front lawn in October (and pet treat bags to hand out to participants and neighbors).
- ❖ The Rev. Drew Genszler, CEO of Lutheran Metropolitan Ministries at the time, worshiped with us and gratefully accepted Good Soil's \$10,000 toward Breaking New Ground (see Breaking New Ground report for more info or watch here).
- ❖ Adult Forums: Pub Theology in Oct (exploring questions of faith together in a bar/restaurant setting) and Planning For Your Funeral in Nov.
- Ordination service of Good Soil's intern and former member, The Rev. Dr. Marilyn Matevia, now serving Celebration Lutheran Church. Ordination service here.
- Communion instruction class held for children.

Winter of 2021/2022:

- ❖ Blessing and Dedication of Little Library (see Open Doors repot).
- ❖ Paraments Task force of a dozen people discerned and planned for new green Good Soil paraments to mark the 4th anniversary of Good Soil.
- ❖ Acolyte training class with the return of acolyte leaders in worship.
- Transition of newsletter from monthly to weekly e-news.
- Development of Job descriptions for staff members.
- ❖ Adult Forums: Ash Wednesday and the Practices of Lent (and preparing ashes-to-go bags) in Feb and Legacy Gift Planning in Mar
- ❖ Good Soil leaders attend three-session workshop, "Becoming a Hybrid Church"

Spring 2022:

- ❖ About 20 adults participated in Lenten Small Groups.
- Throughout Lent we followed the travels and teachings of Jesus with our Lenten passports during the sermon series, "God is on the Move!" We also shared faith stories after the sermons and posted them on our "Faith on the Move" wall.
- Adult Forums: Making Palm Crosses in Apr and Why we do what we do in worship (with worship servant training) in May.
- ❖ First Holy Week in-person in 3 years. Easter was full of energy with 99 people!
- Updated the lease with Meals on Wheels and expanded space for their growing ministry needs downstairs.
- ❖ "Building Joy" roof replacement campaign took place throughout the season of Easter. We heard stories about how joy is shared through this community, view them here. A substantial legacy gift along with \$10,000 generously raised from the congregation will help fund the roof so we can continue cultivating joy in and through this community for years to come!
- New Good Soil Paraments blessed and dedicated on Pentecost Sunday.

In terms of the pastoral office, since July of 2021 I've presided over one baptism, one house blessing, four funerals and held pre-marital counseling sessions for two couples. I've also taught confirmation classes (we joined with First Lutheran, Lorain and Prince of Peace, Westlake this year) and accompanied our joint confirmation students to confirmation camp. I continue to offer pastoral care and visits to our homebound members as well as those who are hospitalized or in rehab or hospice.

Additionally, since Summer of 2021, Good Soil has welcomed 15 official new members. Many of them have shared with me that they were drawn to the vibrance of this place: the authentic and wide welcome (and presence of so many children and families), the spirit-filled worship and music, and the intentional focus on building community through deepening relationships, sharing our faith stories with one another, and so much more.

I, too, am grateful to be a part of this special faith community. It is an honor and a joy to see how the Holy Spirit is bringing forth new life—"bursting forth" in so many, many ways.






Dandelion Team Report

The Dandelion Project is a two-year congregational discernment and vitality journey sponsored by the Northeastern Ohio Synod. 11 congregations, including Good Soil, send a team of people to attend trainings, work closely with a coach, and experiment with activities and ministries in order to further grow spiritually and get re-connected in their neighborhoods. The Dandelion Team at Good Soil is Bill Fink, Mandy Forshey, Barbara Munch, Scott Wylie, Pastor Marissa, and any congregation member who is interested in learning more and helping with this intentional work. Adam Pate and Sharon Hollowell have also attended the guarterly trainings.



So we've been hearing about the Dandelion team from time to time, getting occasional updates, and doing blessings, but what is REALLY happening? Actually, a lot! We have attended several group trainings with other churches that have Dandelion teams and meeting with a coach, learning new ways of looking at engaging more with Christ, each other, and with our community.

With Christ, we have learned how to find more "God moments," (how God is active and present in our everyday lives) and practiced sharing them during meetings and reflection times during worship. With each other, we have shared stories with one another during those reflection times in worship. We also featured "vocational interviews" during the season of Advent where we heard from someone each week

about how their faith informs how they go about their daily job. Another example of engaging with one another was through our "footsteps of faith" stories shared with one another throughout the season of Lent and then posted on the "Faith on the Move" wall at church. And another way we've grown in faith and relationships with one another is through the Lenten Small Groups with almost 20 people participating in 4 different groups—several people enjoying it so much that there's been requests to do small groups again!

Right now, the team is working hard to continue the effort to engage with each other more and build a congregational community that actively and intentionally engages one another at a deeper, spiritual level and helps people grow closer to God by growing closer together as the Body of Christ. Most recently, our homework has been to reach out to members of the congregation we haven't seen in person in a while to check in with them and ask them how we can help them feel more connected. Simultaneously, we are also interviewing leaders in our surrounding community to discern how we as the church might become better, more visible, neighbors in the community (and to strengthen our community relationships as well). The work being done with community leaders is also helping us to identify strengths and needs on both sides of the relationship to see where we can be mutually beneficial to each other and partner with them to share God's love in the community.

Each of these intentional acts of engagement is another plank of the bridge that takes us from where we are to the vision of the church we want to be. The bridge building has been a process, but we are already a stronger internal community as a result, and I am excited to see us get stronger in our surrounding community as well.


Generosity Team Report

The "Generosity Team" was formed mid-2021 with a mission of producing a consistent, credible, and meaningful change in the culture of generosity at Good Soil, both short and long term. Team members remotely attended training programs with Mike Ward, ELCA pastor and author of *Abundance*, from August through November 2021 ahead of the stewardship campaign. Moreover, the team has continued to meet periodically in 2022 in order to review and update Good Soil's vision and strategy for generosity.

The theme of our Fall 2021 stewardship appeal was "Building a Culture of Generosity." This theme pointed us to the generosity that we've witnessed around our church and to discern how we can grow in this practice in even more profound ways. A total of 41 individuals and families returned an intent card for 2022; a 78% response rate of eligible givers. Of those responses, 31 individuals and families elected to increase their giving amount from the previous year, resulting in a 76% increase in overall gift amounts. The annual median increase in gifting was \$520 and the overall annualized gifting amount was projected \$23,617 higher than the previous year.

Livestream and YouTube Channel Report

On June 9, 2021, I received an email from Pastor entitled "Dreaming about the Livestreaming Equipment Upgrade at Good Soil". It's hard to believe what we were dreaming about back in June 2021 has become a reality and then some!

Since that momentous email last June we have accomplished the following:

- Upgraded our video from an iPhone to two pan, tilt, zoom cameras
- Upgraded our sound system: two speakers installed next to the pews, two
 speakers up front facing the pews, two speakers behind the altar, an amplifier, a
 sound mixer, four hearing assistance devices that can be used by individuals in
 their seat (if you'd like more information on these devices, check in with Carl
 Bruns and his awesome headphones!)
- Installed a cart in the back of the sanctuary to house all the livestream equipment: X-keys (to change the camera angles, switch between cameras and media, adjust the audio in realtime), StreamDeck (to move the cameras around), ATEM Mini Pro HDMI Live Switcher (allows us to stream our video/audio/media live to Facebook and YouTube) and a computer
- Installed and configured all the software needed to run a livestream
- And then we went through training to learn how to use it all!

In addition, the amazing Abby Alusheff has been designing and redesigning the hymn and prayer slides we see in person and on the livestream. We will continue tweaking to ensure all can easily follow along with the service. She makes new slides for each service and we appreciate the time she takes each week to make them look great!

We had a few hiccups along the way and we appreciate everyone's patience as we worked through this new process. We can now say all systems are running smoothly (knock on wood)!

While Trey and I were a two person show for a bit, we're happy to report Sean Lanter has officially joined the team and flew solo for the first time on May 15. We also have Michael Wancata going through the training process and we look forward to him running a livestream soon. If anyone is interested in learning more about the system or maybe



even joining the team, please let me or Trey know. It's an amazing way to serve on Sunday mornings!!

But...we're not done yet! Talks are already underway to upgrade the lighting in the sanctuary, which will improve not only the in person experience but make our livestream brighter. Two additional improvements to consider: adding mics to pick up the congregational responses and replacing the projector with two large TVs on both walls in front of the altar. We'll also be digging more into our software to learn all the capabilities to find ways to enhance the livestream experience.

YouTube Report

We've had over 2,000 total views since last June, up 53% over last year and our watch time is up 188% over last year. Our top video in the past year is currently Scott Wylie's sermon from April 24, 2022 with Carl Bruns' faith story a close second.

As mentioned in last year's report, we wanted to continue featuring stories to highlight the people and activities at Good Soil. We have achieved that goal with our Faith Stories during the Lenten Season, Advent Vocational Interviews, and our current Building Joy campaign stories. Breaking New Ground Report

Breaking New Ground, Lutheran Metropolitan Ministry's program to acquire, renovate, and furnish homes to rent to families experiencing homelessness, has made significant progress over the past year. There are currently three units that are occupied by families, and four more that are near completion and expected to be rented at rates that are within their means -- subsidized by BNG Stability Fund proceeds when necessary. The Stability Fund helps ensure that unexpected financial challenges won't cause these families to be under a continual cloud of possibly becoming homeless again. LMM also provides additional services to these families, according to their needs, to help them ultimately become financially independent.

The initial goal of the Breaking New Ground campaign was to raise \$3.5 million. That goal is very close, with only about \$100,000 to go. Good Soil contributed \$10,000 to Breaking New Ground, and offered 1:1 matching funds up to \$10,000 for contributions in 2021 from individuals affiliated with Good Soil. In total, Good Soil's Endowment Fund is releasing \$15,640 to LMM for Breaking New Ground. The level of generosity channeled through this congregation has been meaningful support to LMM's efforts!

Open Doors Report

This past year, Good Soil was a recipient of an Open doors grant from the ELCA. These grants were available to select congregations who applied with a concrete, actionable idea for meeting their neighbors in new and creative ways.

Here is a summary of Good Soil's Open Doors grant initiative:

Good Soil's building is situated on a 4-lane street (Hilliard Blvd) in a residential area. People of all ages walk on the sidewalk in front of the church every day. For months we have been brainstorming ideas for how we can better take advantage of the church's front lawn that borders this sidewalk to meet our neighbors, connect with our community, and be a more visible presence of God's love in our neighborhood.

With the help of Open Doors funds, we will be creating an intentional place on our front lawn that serves as a pedestrian garden/hospitality center/children's play area. As a part of this, we hope to add a few children's play spinner bowl so that kids and families know this church is a place where they are wholly loved by Jesus and can wholly be themselves, and have a lot of fun too! A sign will be placed nearby inviting children and families to take a spin so that they know this is intended as a public area. There are also plans for a Little Library and a bench to be installed.

This area will not only function as a place for our neighbors to rest, meditate, read, and play, but also as a hospitality center for meet-and-greet opportunities such as a Pet Blessing service in the fall, "Ashes-to-go" at the beginning of Lent, and plant giveaways ("grow in faith at Good Soil") and/or lemonade/ice cream giveaways. Each meet-and-greet event will be accompanied by a handout with related scripture and/or information about Good Soil's mission and ministry. We hope these meet-and-greet opportunities will lead to conversations that help us get a better sense of the needs and strengths of our surrounding community as well as how our congregation might use the gifts God has given to us to partner with the community in meeting those needs and building on those strengths. We are grateful for this opportunity, thank you Open Doors!

The grant was awarded to good Soil last year in the amount of \$1500. Our Little Library and accompanying bench will be installed in the coming weeks.
