Will it spend the night at your crib? <sup>10</sup>Can you bind it with a rope to a plowed row; will it plow the valley behind you? <sup>26</sup>"Is it by your wisdom that the hawk soars, and spreads its wings toward the south? <sup>27</sup>Is it at your command that the eagle mounts up and makes its nest on high? <sup>28</sup>It lives on the rock and makes its home in

the fastness of the rocky crag. <sup>29</sup>From there it spies the prey; its eyes see it from far away.
