I will open my mouth in a parable... - Psalm 78:2

I have said these things to you in figures of speech... - John 16:25

God, I AM, is an unfathomable mystery, a power beyond human comprehension, an embrace transcending human speech. However, both the Old and New Testaments use **images to describe and address God**.

Some familiar images, such as "king," recur repeatedly in the Bible. Some are quite startling and occur only once—for example, when God is likened to a drunken soldier (Psalm 78:65) or compared to maggots (Hosea 5:12). Some passages employ nouns, as in "the LORD is my shepherd" (Psalm 23:1). Sometimes the noun is implied, as when God issues forth smoke, fire, and glowing coals, although the word "volcano" is absent (Psalm 18:8).

Psalm 147 ascribes to God twenty-five different verbs, each of which calls to mind its own image. Some images are paradoxical: God, who is our fortress, will help us leap over a wall (Psalm 18:2, 29). Some images describe the wholeness of the triune God, while others refer primarily to one of the three persons of the Trinity.

This selection of one hundred images from the New Revised Standard Version Bible testifies to the plethora of biblical images available for addressing the triune God. Thanks to this wealth of biblical imagery, we can complement those beloved images that we know well with the wide range of other images found in sacred scripture, thus enriching the language of our prayer and praise.

In this brief catalog of images, common Christian interpretation of some parables and narratives, such as seeing the sweeping woman as an image for God (Luke 15:8-9) or the three visitors to Abraham and Sarah as the Trinity (Genesis 18:1-16), have been omitted.

Concerning gender: all nouns in Hebrew and Greek have grammatical gender—for example, rendering *ruah* (Hebrew for breath, wind, or spirit) and *aletheia* (Greek for truth) as feminine. However, because contemporary English ties gender to sexuality, current biblical translations render such nouns as non-gender specific. Further, although often in the Bible a "judge" is pictured as male (Psalm 96:13), Deborah is a judge (Judges 4:4): thus here "judge" is an image not of a man, but of a human.

### as a quality

glory: You, O LORD, are . . . my glory, and the one who lifts up my head. (Psalm 3:3)

hope: You are the hope of all the ends of the earth and of the farthest seas. (Psalm 65:5)

eagle: As an eagle stirs up its nest, and hovers over its young; as it spreads its wings, takes them up, and bears them aloft on its pinions, the LORD alone guided [Jacob]. (Deuteronomy 32:11-12)

hen: How often have I desired to gather your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings. (Matthew 23:37)

lamb: Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. (John 1:29)

leopard: Like a leopard, I will lurk beside the way. (Hosea 13:7)

lion: I will devour them like a lion, as a wild animal would mangle them. (*Hosea 13:8*) serpent: Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up. (*John 3:14*)

#### as a woman

comforting mother: As a mother comforts her child, so I will comfort you. (Isaiah 66:13)

laboring mother: Now I will cry out like a woman in labor. (Isaiah 42:14)

midwife: It was you who took me from the womb; you kept me safe on my mother's breast. (*Psalm 22:9*)

mother: You were unmindful of the Rock that bore you; you forgot the God who gave you birth. (*Deuteronomy 32:18*)

#### as a man

bridegroom: The days will come when the bridegroom is taken away from them, and then they will fast on that day. (Mark 2:20)

father: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. (Matthew 6:9)

husband: . . . a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband. (Jeremiah 31:32)

king: Make a joyful noise before the King, the LORD. (Psalm 98:6)

son: A voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased." (Mark 1:11)

### as an embodied person

breath: The breath of the Almighty gives me life. (Job 33:4)

mouth: One does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of the LORD. (*Deuteronomy 8:3*)

nostrils: At the blast of your nostrils the waters piled up. (Exodus 15:8)

voice: The voice of the LORD is powerful; the voice of the LORD is full of majesty. (*Psalm 29:4*)

### as a human being

advocate: The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything. (*John 14:26*)

avenger: You were a forgiving God to them, but an avenger of their wrongdoings. (*Psalm 99:8*) builder: Long ago you laid the foundation of the earth. (*Psalm 102:25*)

composer: Write this song, and teach it to the Israelites . . . in order that this song may be a witness for me. (*Deuteronomy 31:19*)

creator: The LORD is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. (*Isaiah 40:28*) deliverer: O LORD, my Lord, my strong deliverer, you have covered my head in the day of battle. (*Psalm 140:7*)

friend: My Father, you are the friend of my youth. (Jeremiah 3:4)

garment-maker: The LORD God made garments of skins for the man and for his wife, and clothed them. (*Genesis 3:21*)

healer: I am the LORD who heals you. (Exodus 15:26)

horse rider: There was a white horse! Its rider is called Faithful and True. (Revelation 19:11)

housecleaner: I will sweep it with the broom of destruction, says the LORD of hosts. (Isaiah 14:23)

judge: Shall not the Judge of all the earth do what is just? (Genesis 18:25)

keeper: The LORD is your keeper; the LORD is your shade at your right hand. (*Psalm 121:5*)

lawgiver: The LORD said to Moses: Write these words; in accordance with these words I have made a covenant with you and with Israel. (Exodus 34:27)

maker: May the LORD, maker of heaven and earth, bless you from Zion. (Psalm 134:3)

master: Return, O faithless children, says the LORD, for I am your master. (Jeremiah 3:14)

metalworker: I will smelt away your dross as with lye and remove all your alloy. (Isaiah 1:25)

parent: It was I who taught Ephraim to walk; I took them up in my arms. (Hosea 11:3)

planter: The LORD God planted a garden in Eden. (Genesis 2:8)

potter: Yet, O LORD, . . . we are the clay, and you are our potter. (Isaiah 64:8)

priest: We have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God. (*Hebrews 4:14*)

wrestler: A man wrestled with [Jacob]. . . . So Jacob [said], "I have seen God face to face." (Genesis 32:24, 30)

deity: I will bow down toward your holy temple in awe of you. (Psalm 5:7)

god of weather: Thus says the LORD, who gives the sun for light by day and the fixed order of the moon and the stars for light by night, who stirs up the sea so that its waves roar. (*Jeremiah 31:35*)

goddess of wisdom: Wisdom has built her house. . . . [She says,] "Come, eat of my bread and drink of the wine I have mixed." (*Proverbs 9:1, 5*)

head deity: You are exalted far above all gods. (Psalm 97:9)

monster-slayer: You broke the heads of the dragons in the waters. You crushed the heads of Leviathan. (*Psalm 74:13-14*)

son of man: Then they will see "the Son of Man coming in clouds" with great power and glory. (Mark 13:26)
