Celebrated by Christians around the world, the Season of Creation is a global movement where faith communities focus on how caring for creation is connected to our discipleship as followers of Jesus and as stewards of our shared, wondrous home. On Land Sunday, we remember that Jesus willingly goes into the Earth, redeeming the land from sin and death just as Christ redeems us. Today we worship with the land. the soil. and the land creatures.




