

Third Sunday in the Season of Creation: "River Sunday" And Baptism of Austin Carlson

In today's first reading, Ezekiel sees the river. The river flows out from the Temple, and on either side are trees that never wilt and produce abundant fruit. The waters are clean and clear and fresh, filled with healthy fish. People gather there to draw life from the river, because, "everything will live where the river goes." This isn't a geographical river like the Nile or the Jordan. This is God's river. And the message that Ezekiel's vision held was that God's river can bring new life—just as the waters of Baptism bring new life.



The Word

God speaks to us in scripture reading, preaching, and song.

First Reading: Ezekiel 47:1-12

To put this reading into context:

Ezekiel offers a vision of a river flowing from God's temple. This river is flowing with life which nourishes, heals, and renews.

The response "Word of God. Word of life." acknowledges the power of God's Word to shape our lives. "Thanks be to God" is a historic response which acknowledges that we have heard what was said.

Hear now the reading.


Then he brought me back to the entrance of the temple; there, water was flowing from below the threshold of the temple toward the east (for the temple faced east); and the water was flowing down from below the south end of the threshold of the temple, south of the altar. ²Then he brought me out by way of the north gate, and led me around on the outside to the outer gate that faces toward the east; and the water was coming out on the south side.

³Going on eastward with a cord in his hand, the man measured one thousand cubits, and then led me through the water; and it was ankledeep. ⁴Again he measured one thousand, and led me through the water; and it was knee-deep. Again he measured one thousand, and led me through the water; and it was up to the waist. ⁵Again he measured one thousand, and it was a river that I could not cross, for the water had risen; it was deep enough to swim in, a river that could not be crossed. ⁶He said to me, "Mortal, have you seen this?"

Then he led me back along the bank of the river. ⁷As I came back, I saw on the bank of the river a great many trees on the one side and on the other. ⁸He said to me, "This water flows toward the eastern region and when it enters the sea, the sea of stagnant waters, the water will become fresh. ⁹Wherever the river goes, every living creature that swarms will live, and there will be very many fish, once these waters reach there. It will become fresh; and everything will live where the river goes. ¹⁰People will stand fishing beside the sea; it will be a place for the spreading of nets; its fish will be of a great many kinds, like the fish of the Great Sea. ¹¹But its swamps and marshes will not become fresh; they are to be left for salt. ¹²On the banks, on both sides of the river, there will grow all kinds of trees for food. Their leaves will not wither nor their fruit fail, but they will bear fresh fruit every month, because the water for them flows from the sanctuary. Their fruit will be for food, and their leaves for healing."

Presentation

t Profession of Faith

Jenna, Eric, Matt, and Jordan, I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church.

Do you renounce evil and all the forces that defy God?

Parents and sponsors respond: I renounce them.

Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God?

Parents and sponsors respond: I renounce them.

Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God?

Parents and sponsors respond: I renounce them.

People of God: Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.
