

#### First Sunday in Lent

On Ash Wednesday the church began its journey toward baptismal immersion in the death and resurrection of Christ. This year, our sermon series focuses on the wideness of God's love. One of the ways God communicates God's great love for us is through baptism. In our first reading, God saves Noah's family in the flood with the way God saves us through the water of baptism. The baptismal covenant is made with us individually, but the new life we are given in baptism is for the sake of the whole world.


