



Throughout the Season of Easter, our first reading comes from the book of Acts—tracing the development of the early church after Jesus' resurrection.

God speaks to us in scripture reading, preaching, and song.

New Testament Reading: Revelation 21:10, 22-25, 22:1-5

To put this reading into context:

John's vision of a new Jerusalem coming out of heaven provides continuity with God's past actions. Yet in this new city, God's presence replaces the temple, and the glory of God and the Lamb supplants sun and moon.

Hear now the reading.

¹⁰ And in the spirit [one of the angels] carried me away to a great, high mountain and showed me the holy city Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God.

²² I saw no temple in the city, for its temple is the Lord God the Almighty and the Lamb. ²³ And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God is its light, and its lamp is the Lamb. ²⁴ The nations will walk by its light, and the kings of the earth will bring their glory into it. ²⁵ Its gates will never be shut by day—and there will be no night there.


¹Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, bright

as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb ² through the middle of the street of the city. 

As Jesus talks of returning to the Father, he promises to send the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, who will teach Jesus' followers and remind them of all that Jesus taught. Even more, those in whom God makes a home will experience a peace that overcomes fear.
