RECONCILING IN CHRIST

Sixth Sunday after Pentecost

Perhaps the church, at its best, is “all ears.” God urges the faithful, again and again, to “listen up!”—to heed the word that gives life. So it was with Mary and Martha and the early church at Colossae. So it is today as we join the assembly to hear the word of God, the word of life.

*This letter offers a mystical teaching, that the great mystery of God is
"Christ in you." Because Christ is present in the church, Christians
share in his life, suffering, and glory.*

¹⁵ [Christ Jesus] is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all
creation,¹⁶ for in him all things in heaven and on earth were created,

things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or powers—all things have been created through him and for him. ¹⁷ He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together. ¹⁸ He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything. ¹⁹ For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, ²⁰ and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.

^{23b} I, Paul, became a minister of this gospel, ^{25b} according to God's commission that was given to me for you, to make the word of God fully known, ²⁶ the mystery that has been hidden throughout the ages and generations but has now been revealed to his saints. ²⁷ To them God chose to make known how great among the gentiles are the riches of the glory of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory.
